1. Answer any *four* of the following : 10×4=40

(a) Do you agree that nonfictional prose has always occupied a marginal position in literary history despite the practitioners of this genre having been some of the most eminent names in literature? Give a well-considered response, giving reasons for such a phenomenon.

(b) Do you agree that a blend of 'humour' and 'social realism' explains the success of the spectator essays in voicing and representing the contemporary social concerns? Give reasons for your answer.

- (c) What light do Keats' letters throw on poetic inspiration, inheritance, influence and tradition? Write your answer with illustrations from the prescribed letters.
- (d) How is Arnold's invocation of the practice of the ancients related to his main argument in *Preface to Poems*? Give necessary illustrations from the text.
- (e) Do you agree that Woolf's *How It Strikes a Contemporary* succeeds as essay but fails as literary criticism? Give reasons for your answer.
- (f) Do you agree that Lamb's essay (prescribed for you) exemplifies a typical Romantic obsession with the individual character? Give a well-considered response.
- (g) On what grounds does Tagore criticise nationalism and how persuasive is his critique? Give a balanced response.

BLOCK—II

2. Show how Johnson overcomes or tackles the issue of Milton belonging to a different time period and different religious persuasion in *Life of Milton*.

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Or

If life-writing revolves round the question of fulfillment and worthiness, discuss how Johnson deals with the question of Milton's fulfillment and achievement, considering that he harboured a strong revulsion for many of the things that Milton stood for.
